Park & Recreation Advisory Committee Minutes

August 15, 2012

A meeting of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee for the City of LaVista convened in open and public session at 7:00 p.m. on August 15, 2012. CALL TO ORDER

REPORTS FROM RECREATION DIRECTOR AND STAFF

Assistant Director Karlson reported on summer special classes and events for the Recreation Department and the City of La Vista. The Recreation Department had pre-Picasso art classes for 5-8 year olds, a Little Chef & Storytime, and Summer Escapes at the park along with the Library. A bike safety event was also held this summer. The outdoor movie nights and concerts were attended by many this summer, even with the hot weather.

Program Coordinator South reported on the La Vista Urban Scramble Adventure Race held on August 4, 2012. There were 32 teams of 2 that participated this year. The weather in the morning did not cooperate, so the canoe portion of the race at Walnut Creek had to be cancelled. However, everyone enjoyed the race, and also attended the after party at the La Vista Falls golf course. Lucky Bucket Brewery of La Vista donated beer and Mr. Goodcents sandwiches/chips were served. Others who donated and volunteered for the race were Cabela's. Blue Jay Bar, Farrell's Extreme Bodyshaping, Trek, Aksarben Aquarium, City of La Vista Community Foundation, City of Papillion and Peak Performance Chiropractic and Rehab. South also reported on youth and adult sports for the La Vista Recreation Department:

Current sports activities:

• Flag football will begin on August 18 and continue until October 13. We have 80 kids registered for the fall season.

- Youth soccer academy for 4/5 and 6/7 will also begin August 18. 4/5 will have academy on Tuesday and Saturday, and the 6/7 year olds will have academy on Tuesday, with games on Saturday.
- Lancer soccer is in the Sarpy County League this season. We have 3 teams with 30 players registered. The begin games on September 8.
- Tackle football practice began on August 1. We are in a new league this year, Metro Youth Football League. The first games will be September 9.
- Adult softball summer season ended on August 12. The Fall season will begin on September 4.
- Tackle football Cheerleading has 11 girls this season, and they will take turns cheering at different teams games this season.
- This year we will be having a Fall Baseball Clinic for 3-6 year olds, which will be held at City Park on Thursday evenings for 5 weeks beginning in September.
